EVENT CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT

HV asked VD if she had confirmed that none of our forthcoming meetings will be affected, as this would be the second time we had cut short our meetings, and she advised that it had been checked with the FC the rest of the year was clear and a further agreement between the FC and BAMGOC was to be signed off for 2023.

There was some discussion regarding our Christmas club night buffet, SR said that we should ask the FC who was providing the buffet for the football team in October and maybe we could use them to provide ours in December. VD asked that maybe we could just have mince pies however, VS explained that on the membership forms it states that the summer BBQ (which appear to be impossible at the FC) and the Christmas party were stated as benefits of membership. General opinion was that members enjoyed the Christmas buffet.
